

Open Night and Picnic

It was great to see so many at our open night and picnic last week. Our new families and staff felt most welcomed. The classrooms looked stimulating and the Grade 3-6 students' goals were shared from their Leadership Note Books.

Senior School Sport

Our Grade 6 students participated in their first interschool sports competition last Friday. They and Parktone Primary students rallied together as one team and did us proud.

Lezioni di Italiano Hanno Iniziato (Italian Lessons Have Begun)

The students have been learning greetings and personal statements and questions. It would be helpful for the students to use their new language as often as possible and they are encouraged to practise at home. Vocabulary covered thus far includes: Ciao (hi and bye); Buongiorno (good morning); Buonasera good afternoon and good evening); buonanotte (good night); A presto (see you later); Come ti chiami? (What is your name?); Mi chiamo (My name is); Come stai? (How are you?); Sto bene (I'm fine), Cosi cosi (so so) e (and) Sto male (I'm unwell).



What Time Should I Send the Kids to School?

Student safety is our number one priority, and as in all government schools, staff members are assigned yard-duty at 8:45am, to supervise the students. Department of Education policy recommends that students do not arrive earlier than 8:45am for safety reasons.

Before and After School Care Program

The Before and After School Care Program will begin on Monday, February 27th in the new building. Le Page Primary School will subsidise 50% of the program's total cost to make it more affordable for families to use the service. The 7:30-8:45am session will cost \$5 per child per day, which will include breakfast. The 3:45-6:00pm session cost will be \$8 per child per day, and will include a fruit snack. The program will be managed by Giancarlo Siclari who has managed like programs in other schools. Enrolment forms should be completed and returned to Heather Gillott at the school office by next Thursday, February 23rd for program planning purposes.

Breakfast Club

The breakfast club has been restructured to help meet the needs of our increasing enrolment. Breakfast will be reserved for students participating in the Before School Care Program.

Resiliency Project

To be resilient is to be able to bounce back when the going gets tough. When facing hardship, to be able to manage our emotions and thoughts can mean the difference between sadness and happiness. Last year a team of Parktone teachers researched best practices in teaching social and emotional intelligences and constructed a curriculum targeting mental health. Last week the whole staff participated in a professional development program, which focused on three key principles: gratitude, empathy and mindfulness. Our students will be introduced to the three principles next week and together the staff and students will learn to practice gratitude, empathy and mindfulness on a daily basis. The aim is to develop emotional strength in every individual and as a collective. An information session was held this week and over 500 parents from Le Page and Parktone went along to hear inspirational speaker Martin Heppel. Martin delivered a powerful and moving presentation highlighting the importance of building, practicing and modelling resilience.
